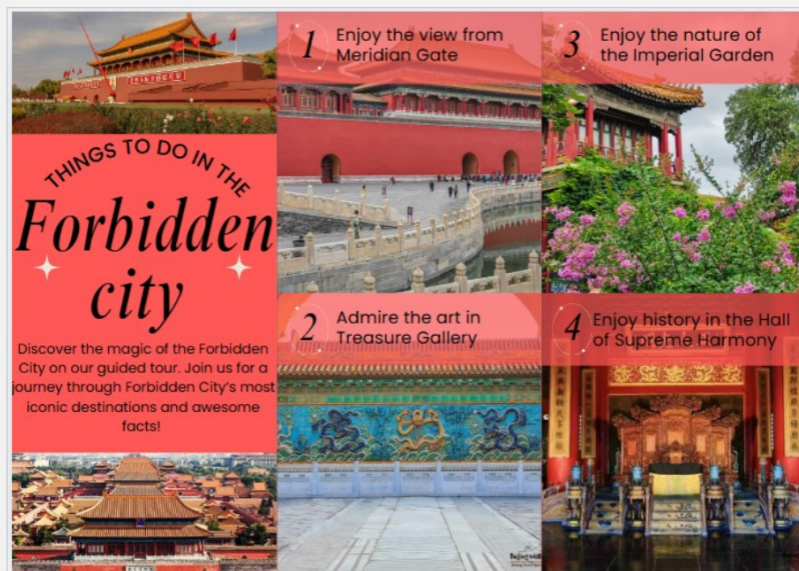
Grades 1-3: The lower grades class is currently writing short books. Here are the title pages for a few of them.

<p>3 Treasure Gallery</p> <p>It represents the highest level of court craftsmanship in the Qing Dynasty. Treasure Gallery has been one of the Palace Museum's most important permanent exhibitions</p>	<p>4 Supreme Harmony</p> <p>Used for grand ceremonies such as the Emperor's enthronement ceremony, the Emperor's wedding and the ceremony for conferring the Empress. The 35.5 meters high hall has a double-layered roof which represents the highest construction rank in the whole empire and thus is exclusively for the emperor.</p>
